Title I Reading:

Read a Book, Write a Math Problem

Combine reading, writing, and math by having your child make up word problems based on his/her favorite book.

Here's how:

If she reads *The Rainbow Fish*, she could write (or dictate to you) a story problem like, "Rainbow fish had 10 colorful scales. He gave 9 away. How many are left?" Or after reading *The Gingerbread Man*, your child might make up a word problem such as, "The gingerbread man ran from 3 people and 3 animals. How many chased him in all?"

Idea: Have your child read and act out the story problems. She could use household items like foil scraps for fish scales or toy people and animals.

-December is usually a busy and sometimes stressful month. Spending quiet one-on-one time with your children can mean more than any toys or material gifts. They will remember baking cookies, reading holiday stories, or playing board games with the family long after the toys are forgotten or broken!

-To help with relieving some of the stress and freeing up some time, second graders will not have homework during the last week before winter break (**Dec. 19-23**). However, please take time to read books and cuddle with your child!

Third Grade

In November, third grade completed the second round of DAP testing in the computer lab. Students are learning to apply test-taking strategies, and use problem-solving skills to solve complex math and reading questions. Please continue to work on the basic math facts at home to build fluency and confidence.

This month, we will have our second book report project. Each child should be reading a chapter book for the nightly reading and write a 7 word summary sentence on their reading log. Please make sure your child is reading a book they have not read before. Students should complete the book by December 8th. During the week of December 12th, students will work on the project for homework. All projects need to be turned in no later than December 16th to be ready to present by December 19th.

In December, we will have some holiday projects to complete in class. Please make sure your child brings in a medium sized glass jar and a shoebox. Thank you in advance for your supply donations. Have a wonderful holiday season!

Fourth Grade

We appreciate your continuous support. Remember the importance of studying math facts. Fourth grade is running low on dry erase markers. We would appreciate if your child can bring one marker from home to use in class. Thank you parents with your support in encouraging your child to practice their recorders! The concert will be here sooner than we realize!

Fifth Grade

This is a short but VERY busy month for all of us! Please check your child's planner daily and their work packets weekly to keep up with all that is going on. We have two fieldtrips coming up. One in December and one in January. **Notice: Students who are missing assignments and/or have had bad behavior issues could be ineligible for the fieldtrips. We are accepting late work, in a reasonable amount of time, on certain assignments, but as always it is at the teacher's discretion.**

For our first fieldtrip, we will be attending Tucson Village Farm on **December 15th**. The students will spend time farm planting, harvesting, doing a vegetable "scavenger hunt", learn about worms and compost, and participate in food preparation. They will also do several hands-on dynamic nutrition education lessons and have a healthy snack.

Our next fieldtrip will be to Old Tucson Studios and we will be needing chaperones for this one. It is on Thursday, **January 26th**, so check your schedule to see if you are able to attend, sign the permission slip as soon as you get it and return it with your child.

And finally, fifth grade will be holding "The Rock Shop" again this year. This will be held during the week of **December 5-9**. The students will learn about running a business. They will be involved with: inventory, learning about sales, and customer service. This will be a great way for them to get some Christmas shopping done. Have them save their pennies! ****NOTE: This is also during Grandparents Week, so they can shop with their grandparents at lunch as well as during their assigned class time.**

Thank you for all that you do for your child in helping them stay organized and on task here at school. We couldn't do it without your help.

Sixth Grade

Life in 6th grade continues to move quickly.

We have finished up field trips until UA Sky School in March. We will be discussing fundraising opportunities sometime in the near future with students for that field trip.

Health Office

HEARING AND VISION: If you have been notified that your child has not passed a vision or hearing screening it is imperative that you follow-up with your child's physician or eye care facility. Your child's education depends on it.

SHOTS: If your child is missing any immunizations please follow-up with their physician to get the necessary immunizations required for school.

MEDICATIONS: Please do not send your child to school with over the counter medications; this includes cough drops. It is against school district policy unless it accompanied by a prescription from your child's physician. All medications must be accompanied with the box that has either the label from the pharmacy or a prescription from the physician. Medications may not be given without a prescription and parent permission.

LOST AND FOUND: We have a lot of jackets in the lost and found. Please stop by and claim yours. All jackets will be donated during winter break.

GUIDELINES for PARENTS

When to Keep Your Student Home from School

If your child has any of these symptoms, please keep him/her home from school, or make appropriate child care arrangements.

- **FEVER** – temperature of 100 degrees Fahrenheit or higher. Remember that a child must be fever free for 24 hours before returning to school without fever reducing medication.
- **PERSISTENT COUGH** – should be seen by a health care provider unless already diagnosed. Some conditions may be contagious and require treatment.
- **EYES** – thick mucus or pus draining from a red eye (conjunctivitis).
- **SEVERE SORE THROAT** – especially with fever or swollen glands in the neck.
- **DIARRHEA/VOMITING** – watery stools or episodes of vomiting may be contagious.
- **UNUSUAL SKIN RASHES** – Unusual body rashes need to be identified before sending a child to school. Any draining skin wounds will also need a diagnosis. .
- **EAR PAIN** – Children with ear pain do NOT need to be excluded but the child needs to get medical treatment and follow-up. Untreated ear infections can cause permanent hearing loss.
- **FOLLOWING INJURY/HOSPITALIZATION/SURGERY** – written medical release and doctor's instructions for care during school day are required especially students in wheelchairs, on crutches or in casts. School does not provide wheelchairs

If your child shows any of the above symptoms at school, it may be necessary to pick him/her up from school.

Bringing a child to school with any of the above symptoms puts other children and staff at risk of getting sick. If all parents keep their sick children at home, we will have stronger, healthier and happier children. While we regret any inconvenience this may cause, in the long run this means fewer lost work days and less illness for parents.

Please make sure you let Mrs. Agraan know if you have a child that will be out for any reason. Many people remember to tell the teacher, but forget to let the office know. If it is an excused absence Mrs. Agraan needs to know so she can mark it as such.
