Title I Reading:

Start the New Year Off Right: Resolve to Raise a Reader!

Many New Year's resolutions focus on developing healthy habits. Here's one that is important to make and keep: provide a regular diet of books and reading for your child.

Read every day

A daily reading routine will give all the readers in your family a chance to read with your child. Dads, moms, siblings, caregivers, and friends can all be a part of ensuring your child gets 20 minutes of being read to each day.

Do things, and then talk about it

It's great to offer new experiences to your child, such as a visit to the zoo or museum, but a trip to the grocery store or a neighborhood park can be just as educational. Talk about what you are seeing and ask your child what he thinks of it. When possible, use interesting words to describe what you're seeing.

Read everywhere you go

You can find reading on the road, at the bus stop, in the store, and at the restaurant. Play a game to find words when you are out and about or take a look at home for words on everyday items like cereal boxes, toothpaste, and household appliances.

Be a reading role model

Your child wants to imitate you and be like you. Have plenty of reading material for yourself as well as for your child. Tell your child how much you enjoy reading.

During all this excitement, sometimes the third quarter tends to be a time when students are not as motivated and grades tend to drop. You can help to keep your child motivated by checking in each day and talking about school. Discuss the homework that is sent home and check to see that it is done correctly. Check in with your child on subtraction math facts because it is harder this quarter. Keep a regular routine for bedtime and getting homework done and especially, keep up the nightly reading! Thank you for your support and teamwork to help your child prepare for the future and thrive in second grade!

Third Grade

We will be taking our third DAP tests in February, and AzMERIT is right around the corner in March. This semester, we will have three math fact tests for the math awards: addition, subtraction, and multiplication. Students will have three minutes on each test (50 problems each). Please encourage your child to do their personal best every day!

This quarter we are learning about water. We will be taking a field trip to the Sweetwater Wetlands the end of February, so please keep your eye out for information on that. With testing approaching, it is critical for all students to be reading nightly and completing all homework assignments. Your child should be halfway through another chapter book, and keeping track of the story on the daily reading log. We will send home information on another book report project soon.

Fourth Grade

January was a busy month for fourth graders. In Science we will begin our Unit on Weather. Be sure to ask your little meteorologist about their hands on learning!

In the area of math, math fact mastery continues to be of utmost importance. Studying to reach the highest level possible of the Math Fact Award requires practice and determination.

In reading, students have had a great start to the semester! Theme 4 Essential Question is “What is creativity and does it make our lives better?” The stories the students have been reading from their anthologies have been about inventors, artists and a tale about giant parents. Our next writing project will align with the essential question coming up very soon. It is appreciated that each student have a chapter book for class each day. Continue to study for weekly vocabulary tests.
