

# A Message from the Principal

Hawk Families,

Our year is off to another great start! We had more families join us for our open house and parent curriculum/orientation nights this year. If you haven't had a chance to meet your child's teacher, I encourage you to do so soon, via phone, email or stop by. Together we will make all Hawks Soar with Pride! We believe that through our teamwork we are **NOT JUST STRONG #HawksAreA+Strong**.

The staff has been working to plan lessons that are more problem based. We have adopted a new Math curriculum. Teachers have all started a writing project that will require all students to develop deeper writing skills. Please help challenge your child to read each and every night. It is critical that students develop stamina for reading longer passages in order to be successful in this forever changing global economy. Problem based Math will challenge your students this year. The focus of Math will be to **understand** rather than just compute concepts. We are working as a staff to teach grit and perseverance. Effort is not an option. It is expected of all Hawks. We believe each and every student at Hendricks can continue to push individual levels of mastery higher.

**PTO**—Our first meeting, August 23, 2016 was very productive. Lots of great information was discussed including planning of the annual **Hendricks Community Picnic**. Join us **Friday, September 9<sup>th</sup> from 4:30—6:30 pm**. Plan to come with your family to get to know our new Hawk families or get reacquainted with old friends. Pack a picnic meal or pick up some food on your way. PTO will be selling cold drinks and pizza, as well as having a bake sale. A DJ will be on hand for your listening pleasure. For dessert, PTO will have a bake sale and frosty treats set up for you to purchase. Box tops are a great way for our school to make extra cash.

**Fundraising Kickoff**—During the day, on September 9<sup>th</sup>, students will attend the kick off assembly for our largest fundraiser, which will be *Aspire*. **Parents:** Please be sure to update the school with changes to your contact information (home phone, email, and/or cell phone) in order to receive important school-wide notification.

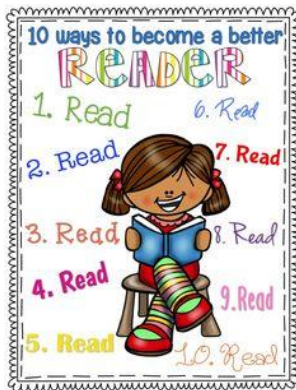
## **Awards Assembly**

## **Health Office**

All students must have a valid immunization record on file per Arizona state law. All 11 year old 6<sup>th</sup> graders are required to have TDAP and Meningitis Immunizations by September 1, 2016 for the 2016-2017 School Year. Parents will be called to pick up students that are not in compliance on this day.

## **Medication Policies:**

All Over the counter (OTC) and prescribed medications (Rx) must be brought or picked up from the Health Office by a parent/guardian. All OTC and Rx medications must have a prescription from physician; medications are not allowed to be given without it. A parent/guardian must fill out a permission form in order for your child to receive medication at school. Cough drops, Tylenol, Ibuprofen, allergy medicine are all examples of OTC and must have a prescription from a physician.

## **Medical Concerns:**

If your child has any pertinent medical history that may affect your child's safety while at school please notify Mrs. Leon in the office at the earliest time possible. **We are in need of new undergarments for our Hawks. ## **Kindergarten**

Hello Kindergarten Families. Welcome to September! We had a great first month of school getting to know all of our kids and families. We celebrated the first couple of weeks in kindergarten dressing up like the animals in *Brown Bear, Brown Bear, What do you See?* Thank you to all the families who participated and donated a colorful snack to our classes. As September approaches, please remember to continue to help your child write his/her own name by themselves. Remind them that the first letter in their name is always capital and the rest of the letters lowercase. Also, the weather is still quite warm. Please send your child to school with a water bottle, labeled with their names. We will also be sending home a reading log at the beginning of the month to help encourage you to read with your child nightly!

## **First Grade**

We are very excited to be working with you this year! Homework is a great way to teach our young Hawks how to be responsible! Our day starts with a simple procedure “**Folders First**”. First Graders have learned how to insert & remove their own papers into/from the “R” pocket (Return to School) and “K” pocket (Keep at Home). Please help your child be successful with these few reminders: (1) **Return Homework Folders & Calendars** to school daily. (2) **The Homework Calendar** lists the daily assignments so look for the corresponding page(s) in the folder. (3) **Record Reading Homework** by writing the title of the fluency passage or book you and your child read & then sign the Reading Homework Log daily (on the back of the calendar) and return with the completed assignment(s) each day so credit can be earned for the report card grade.

**Many, many thanks** for continuing to provide class snacks and water bottles for our recess breaks! Your support was appreciated at our Parent Orientation Night and for signing up to volunteer on our field trips. We couldn't do it without you!

## **Second Grade**

Second graders are off to a fabulous start! First, we are excited to have Miss Dennis on our team as a new second grade teacher! Miss Puccini is also here from the U of A, student teaching with Mrs. Hitchings. In class, we are having fun learning the Daily 5 Literacy Centers and schedule, doing activities with math manipulatives and games to help build concepts, making connections with stories we are reading, and building safe, caring learning environments. Be sure to ask your child what bucket filling is!

Our Mini-Muster with the Northwest Fire Department will take place **October 19<sup>th</sup>**. That is coming up fast! Be sure to put the date on your calendar. We will send more information home soon, but this event is a great opportunity for parents to be involved. It will take up most of the morning on that day.

Thank you to all the parents who came to Open House and Parent Curriculum/Orientation Night and those who have been sending in classroom snacks and school supplies. Remember to keep a regular homework routine. Always encourage your child to do his/her best. If your child is struggling at home with homework, please let their teacher know. Parents & teachers working together to support children makes such a difference. Thank you for your support and teamwork!

We look forward to having a year filled with learning, fun, and creativity!

## **Third Grade**

Thank you for sending supplies to help your child get organized for the year ahead. We are looking forward to an exciting year with our third graders. Students are tackling a new math series and learning how to construct viable arguments for how to solve problems. In science, we have started our rock investigations and will continue to learn about earth materials throughout the month of September. Reading is a critical subject in third grade, so please make sure your child is reading nightly and completing their reading log. We will begin our weekly fluency homework **September 19<sup>th</sup>**. Please join us on **September 7<sup>th</sup>** at one of the two times: 2:30-3:00 or 5:00-5:30 p.m., when we will discuss the steps to completing fluency homework. Continue to check your child's homework folder and sign the planner, reading log, and spelling contract daily. We appreciate your communication and support. We look forward to a fabulous year with you and your child!

## Fourth Grade

*#Teamwork #TheEssentialPiece.* We are looking forward to working with you this year and appreciate your commitment to your child's education! We also appreciate your generous and thoughtful donations! Thank you for your attendance at orientation. It was nice to meet you.

Fourth Grade is on a roll! We're on a roll with lots of fun learning, and we're on a roll with establishing valuable routines! **Homework completion** is at the top of the valuable routine list. Remember students have at least **three** pieces of homework to complete every night, **Monday through Thursday**. Please review the Homework Policy in your child's homework folder.

**Good behavior** in class is also a must. Students are expected to come to class prepared with their materials and focus on the learning. Doing so will result in top notch academics!

Working in class is important, as is **studying at home**. Students are expected to review and study material learned in class for regular quizzes and tests. **Spelling, Vocabulary, and Reading Comprehension tests will take place every Friday**. Math, Science, and Social Studies tests will take place at the end of units of study. **Math fact** quizzes will be given regularly, so it is vital that students practice consistently (minimal class time is available, so study at home is mandatory for success.) Welcome **Ms. Featherstone**, Long-term substitute for Mrs. Wendt.

Please keep in communication either by phone, student planner or by email.

## Fifth Grade

The Fifth Graders have hit the ground running with many academic endeavors as they begin the new school year! For starters, all of the 65 students have learned all 53 prepositions already. We could not be more proud of this fantastic achievement! This will help with their grammar as we begin our journey in Easy Grammar.

In Math class, the students have begun working in our new math series, Investigations 3, Pearson. You should have received a bright pink letter by now explaining how to set up an account online. These were given out during Parent Orientation. If you were not able to attend, they were sent home with your child. This will allow you and your student access to new learning tools. They will have access to resources, games, ideas for activities at home, and additional copies of homework and daily practice handouts. It is very easy to set up. The directions are very clear.

Science will start later, and will bring the study of the Human Body including the skeleton, joints, and muscles. Social Studies has the students learning the correct spellings and locations of all 50 states and will later involve colonization, Revolutionary War, Civil War, and a government unit.

Grammar and Writing will be tied into our Harcourt Reading series using the Common Core Standards.

Please make sure you are checking your child's planner **DAILY** for academic and behavioral updates. Thank you for all your support as we look forward to an amazing year in 5<sup>th</sup> Grade!

## Sixth Grade

Thank you for a great start to 6<sup>th</sup> grade! Please remember to check your child's planner nightly for their homework assignments. We are off to a great start with our schoolwork.

**Math.** It is year two of Big Ideas math which incorporates a problem-based style curriculum. We cover one concept every two days and end each chapter with a test. Students are allowed to take home their books and we encourage parents and students to search out addition resources like Khan Academy on YouTube if they need help. Help is also available from Ms. Fuca and Mr. Jungbluth in the morning on most days.

**Reading** at home is also an important piece to developing reading skills that will be used in the classroom. It is important that reading be done at home every night, even when it is not assigned. Your student has started his or her book in Book Clubs. All students are currently reading *The Hobbit*. Ask them about the book they are reading!

In **Social Studies**, we are working on our first unit, looking at how geography affects the movement and settlement of people. We are using our Social Studies texts to support our thinking in our writing and developing a working knowledge of how to cite the text.

We have just started our **Science** kits and will be studying Weather and Water. We are looking forward to great things this year!

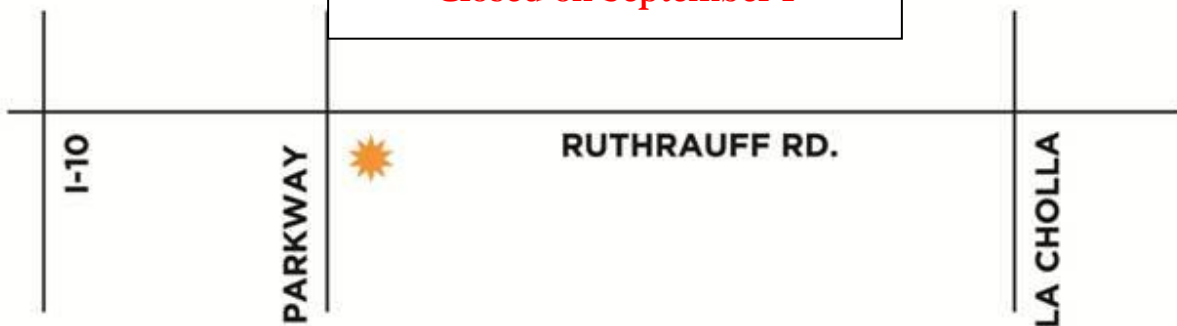
