#### FROM THE DESK OF THE PRINCIPAL:

Hawk Families,

I want to thank everyone for helping make a great start to the 2023-2024 school year! We are pleased to welcome Mrs. Jessica Cenedese, our new Assistant to the Principal, to Hendricks! Also, we were excited to welcome many families for our combined open house and parent orientation night this year. It is always wonderful to see families visiting the school and learning all about their child's new classroom. If you have not had a chance to meet your child's teacher, I encourage you to do so soon via phone, email, or by stopping in for a visit. It is important for each child's academic success that we establish relationships between school and home early in the year.

The staff has been working hard to incorporate cooperative learning into our day while teaching classroom rules and procedures. In addition, we are getting into routines with our reading and writing curriculum, *Into Reading*. Please help us build a culture of reading by challenging your child to read at least 20 minutes every night. It is critical that students develop stamina for reading longer passages to be successful in school. As we continue with *Investigations* mathematics, students will further their understanding on why mathematics works the way that it does. You can help students be successful with deep thinking in math by helping them develop fluency in basic addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division facts. When children don't have to think as hard about these basic facts, they are better able to use their brains for critical thinking. Log on to Reflex math, use some flash cards, or find a fun online game to encourage children to practice facts!

about waiting to cross in front of the school until an adult can escort them across the drop-off zone. Please remember that there is **no parking in the drop-off zones** in front of the school or off of the main parking lot and it is important that you say a quick goodbye and move out of the drop-off area. Please do not wait in your car in the entryway to the school or in the south side loop. Leaving cars in these areas blocks the thoroughfare, backs up traffic, and creates a danger for students as cars try to navigate around them. Please also respect any signs on public roads that state no parking or no standing. Also, as a reminder, our new policy is that adults must drop off students at the doors and may only come on campus if they have an appointment. Last, our new school office safety sys tem requires that visitors ring the bell and stand in front of the camera for entry. If arriving late, please always escort children to the door and buzz them into the office.


#### Hello Hawk Families!

#### **Medication Policies:**

All Over the counter (OTC) and prescribed medications (Rx) must be brought or picked up from the Health Office by a parent/guardian. All OTC and Rx medications must have a prescription from a physician, medications are not allowed to be given without it.

A parent/guardian must fill out a permission form in order for your child to receive medication at school. Tylenol, Ibuprofen, allergy medicine are all examples of OTC and must have a prescription from a physician.

NO MEDICATION WILL BE ACCEPTED BY TEACHERS OR THE FRONT OFFICE.

All medications including asthma inhalers and epi pens must be in their original RX labeled box or pill bottle, no exceptions. Your pharmacist can assist you with this.



Thank you for attending parent orientation and for sending supplies to help your child get organized for the year ahead. We are looking forward to an exciting year with our third graders. Students are tackling new math concepts and learning to construct viable arguments to solve problems. We encourage all students to utilize the Reflex

Math program at home to help improve their fact fluency.

In science, we have started our ecosystem unit focusing on the Sonoran Desert. We will have our first field trip to the Desert Museum in November. Reading is a critical subject in third grade, so please make sure your child is reading every night and writing a summary sentence on their reading log. We will have a parent fluency training night on September 28th and will begin our weekly fluency homework the following week. Please continue to check your child's homework folder and sign their agenda/planner daily. We appreciate your communication and support and look forward to a fabulous year with you and your child



Welcome to Fourth Grade! We can't believe that we have already had a month with your amazing kiddos. We have really enjoyed getting to know them over these past four weeks. If you were able to attend parent orientation, thank you for coming! We look forward to building a relationship and getting to know all our students' families. If you have not joined your child's class app, please reach out to your child's teacher as this is our main line of communication this year.

It may seem like school just started, but we have already begun our second unit in math. This unit focuses on data and measurement. Students will complete two data projects throughout the course of this unit. The first project compares fourth grade heights to first grader heights. Students create line plots to display their data and then look for trends and outliers. In the second data project, students derive their own testable question, gather data, and then display the data of two different groups on one graph or line plot. The culmination of this project is a reflection of data trends and gives students an opportunity to reflect on the data gathering process.

In reading, we have completed Module One and just began Module Two. Students have read a variety of texts and began completing close reads for specific targeted reading skills. Many of these skills build upon third grade learning but become more advanced. Students have enjoyed reading a variety of texts ranging from a graphic novel excerpt to a folktale to informational non-fiction text.

During the last week of August, students wrapped up their first of many writing projects that spanned over a course of three weeks. This project was a narrative about a time in their life when they learned a lesson or made a discovery. The story had to incorporate dialogue and have a problem/solution. Students enjoyed sharing these stories with their classmates. It was a great first project to get them going on writing this year. We have also been completing some collaborative literary analysis paragraphs, also known as a cold write. These are similar to the ones they were completing in third grade, but we are teaching students how to incorporate elaboration. This is when students explain how their text evidence connects to the writing prompt in their own words.

We know that this year is going to be a great year! Thank you for sharing your child with us.

# 5th Grade

We want to thank everyone who has contributed to the wonderful start of our new school year. There are a lot of exciting things happening in 5th grade this semester! So far, we have learned about various inventors and inventions, building balloon powered race cars, multiplication strategies, solving order of operation problems, and learning about different types of sentences. We have upcoming field trips to the Desert Museum and Sabino Canyon. Keep an eye out for permission slips if you would like to chaperone.

Please do not hesitate to reach out to the fifth-grade teachers with any questions, comments, or concerns. We are looking forward to the rest of the year together.



Hello 6th grade families! If you have not already, please join our Remind class using the Remind app using the class code @hhawks6.

In Science, students learned about the scientific method and then practiced the method with an origami frog lab. They also learned the engineering method and practiced that with a seed dispersal lab. We just began our first unit on ecosystems. Students have been given access to their online science textbook through Savvas Realize. This textbook includes text that can be read to students by the computer, interactive labs, and quests.

The big ideas that were covered in math this month include using the standard long division algorithm, exponents, greatest common factor, and least common multiple. We will apply our knowledge of GCF and LCM to fraction concepts such as simplifying fractions and finding common denominators throughout the year.

In Social Studies/Writing, we are working on our first unit, looking at how geography affects the movement and settlement of people. We have introduced a textbook and accompanying workbook. With our materials, we are addressing reading and writing skills through a social studies lens. We have been learning how to use our resources through notetaking and various activities, and we will be finishing the unit with a narrative essay based on unit one material to strengthen their writing and understanding of the topic.





# Take advantage of the AZ School Tax Credit

Using your Arizona School Tax Credit to help a child get more out of school.

Arizona law (ARS 43-1098.01) allows taxpayers to receive a tax credit of up to \$400 for donations that benefit students in our public schools. That's not just a deduction, it's a tax credit—it reduces what you owe in state taxes, dollar-for-dollar.

#### Here's how it works:

Just send a donation to the Flowing Wells School District, earmarked for support of one of our many qualifying extracurricular activities. We'll send you a receipt for your records. Then, when you fill out your Arizona state taxes, you can subtract your donation from what you owe in taxes. Credits should be taken in the year donated; however, donations made from January 1—April 15 can be used in either the current or prior year.

#### What qualifies:

By law, only donations to extracurricular activities that charge a fee qualify for the tax credit. Donations must be made to the school district, but directed toward a specific activity at a specific school.

You may specify that your donation is a contribution that benefits all children, or you may designate it to cover a current fee for a specific child's participation in a qualified activity.

Just fill out the form then make your donation in person at any Flowing Wells school or mail it, along with your check, to Flowing Wells School District.
