PROPOSITION 202 COMPENSATION

The first half of Proposition 202 compensation will be distributed to certified teachers in the December 5th paycheck in the amount of \$350. Funding for Proposition 202, the Indian Gaming and Self-Reliance Act, is based on state gaming revenue. Only certified teachers are eligible to receive these funds which are distributed each December and May.

RETENTION/RECRUITMENT STIPENDS

In early November, all FW employees will receive a letter detailing the amount of retention/recruitment stipend they can expect to receive in the December 5th paycheck. Employees who worked during any part of the 2022-2023 school year and who maintain employment in the District through December 5, 2023 are eligible for the retention stipend. The maximum retention stipend of \$1,000 will be provided to fulltime (40 hours/week) employees. The stipend will be prorated for employees who work less than full time. Stipend amounts for less-than-full-time employees are based on each employee's 2023-2024 FTE as indicated on the initial contract/work agreement/SPAR. Those employees who were hired after May 26, 2023 and who maintain employment in the District through December 5, 2023 are eligible for the recruitment stipend. The maximum recruitment stipend of \$500 will be provided to full-time (40 hours/week) employees. The stipend will be prorated for employees who work less than full time. Stipend amounts for less-than-full-time employees are based on each employee's 2023-2024 FTE as indicated on the initial contract/work agreement/SPAR.
