Notes from Mrs. Finchum

Hawk Families:

To quote a famous holiday tune, "It's the most wonderful time of the year!" December and the holidays are upon us and Hendricks is buzzing with excitement as we move into a month full of learning, fun, and celebration. A special thank you to the parents who helped us serve Thanksgiving dinner at Hendricks!

Before I share a bit about the upcoming fun this month, I would like to convey a few reminders. Please continue to make **attendance** a priority for your child when they are not ill. If at all possible, please do not schedule trips during school days. If your child must be absent, please call the school by 9:00 am to report the absence. All students will be required to make up work from days they miss at school. Encouraging regular school attendance is one of the most powerful ways you can prepare your child for success—both in school and in life. At our first awards assembly of the year, we were pleased to **recognize 348 students who had exceptional attendance** by attending more than 95% of the school days in the first quarter and arriving on time daily!

Second, please remember to **drive slowly and safely** as you drop students off in front and on the south side of Hendricks in the morning. Many students cross the walkway in front of the school and it is essential that all drivers are alert and moving slowly. Please be patient as you wait for cars to unload so that we can limit unnecessary passing and weaving that could be dangerous. Remember that we need to keep the car line moving, so please pull all the way to the front and have your child quickly disembark. If your child needs extra assistance or an escort, please park so that we can keep traffic moving in the drop-off zones. Last, please do not jaywalk across Camino de la Tierra as this presents a danger to our community and is against the law. Thank you for your attention to this matter!

Lastly, as the calendar year comes to a close please consider supporting our school with a **tax credit donation**. Tax **credit** dollars are used for field trips, extra-curricular activities, and school-wide assemblies. Arizona law allows taxpayers to receive a tax credit of up to \$400 per family for donations made to public schools. Tax credit donations may still be made for 2023 and are accepted through April 15, 2024. If you are able to donate, it would make all the difference to our school. In Mr. Johnson's class

We just completed an interesting unit on how animals use their bodies. We simulated the way birds use their beaks and wings in different ways, made animals that move, and wrote a multi-page report on cheetahs that included facts about how and where they live. This all came on the heels of watching caterpillars turn into butterflies right before our eyes in the classroom!

We took a wonderful field trip to the Reid Park Zoo. We will extended our in-class science lessons to social studies and talked about how animals interact and form social groups. We are focusing on positive interactions in learning and games to understand groups and communities and why it is important to get along.

Our students are showing great reading growth! Homework support has been strong and that is really helping our reading levels soar.

In math we are adding three numbers and finding missing parts, which is early algebra. We are also measuring length and surface area. We use curriculum games and activities, as well as partner and team interactions to spur learning.

Our class was honored by the music and P.E. specials teachers as very well-behaved class in first grade this quarter. That thrilled the kids and they are admiring their awards during the day.

We are also filling those "fluffy puffy" cups to earn prizes for good work and behavior. That is part of our positive rewards system. It's a joy to see students light up when they empty that cup and gather their rewards.

Tell us something interesting about yourself that we may not know.



Take advantage of the AZ School Tax Credit

Using your Arizona School Tax Credit to help a child get more

Arizona law (ARS 43-1098.01) allows taxpayers to receive a tax credit of up to \$400 for donations that benefit students in our public schools. That's not just a deduction, it's a tax credit—it reduces what you owe in state taxes, dollar-for-dollar.

Here's how it works:

Just send a donation to the Flowing Wells School District, earnarked for support of one of our many qualifying extracurricular activities. We'll send you a receipt for your records. Then, when you fill out your Arizona state taxes, you can subtract your donation from what you owe in taxes. Credits should be taken in the year donated, however, donations made from January 1—April 15 can be used in either the current or prior year.

What qualifies:

By law, only donations to extracurricular activities that charge a fee qualify for the tax credit. Donations must be made to the school district, but directed toward a specific activity at a specific school.

You may specify that your donation is a contribution that benefits all children, or you may designate it to cover a current fee for a specific child's participation in a qualified activity.

Just fill out the form then make your donation in person at any Flowing Wells school or mail it, along with your check, to Flowing Wells School District.
